Special Needs Education in Nagoya City

Special support education is to support the independent efforts of children with disabilities toward self-reliance and social participation, to understand the educational needs of each child, and to provide appropriate guidance and necessary support to enhance their abilities and improve or overcome difficulties in life and learning. We will

introduce "learning places" and "support" where students can develop their abilities to the fullest.

Educational consultation and school choice

In Nagoya City, vice principal of your school district is the contact person for educational consultation. During the educational consultation, the type and degree of the student's disability will be taken into consideration, and the appropriate type of education and place of learning will be determined, while respecting the wishes of the student and his/her guardians to the maximum extent possible.

Steps to choosing a school/class to attend


The following procedure is used to select a place of study, such as a regular class, a classroom, a special-needs class, or a special-needs school, and to decide where to enroll the child, while promoting educational consultation with the school.


The place of study decided upon at the time of enrollment is not a fixed place, but the student can change classes or schools as necessary, taking into consideration the developmental level and adjustment status of each student.


Consultation by a vice-principal in the local school district

Education at special needs education schools

Nagoya City has five special needs schools, all of which are for the intellectually disabled.

All special needs schools for the visually impaired, hearing impaired, physically disabled, or sickly or physically weak are prefectural special needs schools. In all cases, students will enroll after receiving educational counseling at their local school (a Nagoya City elementary or junior high school) and then receiving educational counseling at the special needs school.

Moriyama Special Needs School High School (Industrial Studies) and Wakamiya Special Needs High School have set up a variety of courses for students with relatively mild intellectual disabilities, and provide instruction centered on vocational education with the aim of finding employment in companies, etc.

Education at Nagoya municipal special needs education schools for intellectually disabled students

The following schools are designed for intellectually disabled students who need constant assistance in daily living due to communication difficulties. Education at these schools aims to help students establish basic lifestyle habits and develop social and vocational skills.

For Moriyama Special Needs School High School (Industrial Department) and Wakamiya Special Needs High School, acceptance or rejection is determined through an entrance selection process.

<u>Special needs education schools for visually impaired students</u> (All are run by Aichi Prefecture.)

These schools use regular, large-print or braille textbooks according to the severity of impairment and let students learn through auditory and tactile senses, thereby helping alleviate and overcome difficulties caused by visual problems.

<u>Special needs education schools for hearing impaired students</u> (All are run by Aichi Prefecture.)

In addition to providing elementary and junior high school education, these schools guide students to improve their ability to hear, speak, read and write using a hearing aid and other devices, thereby helping alleviate and overcome difficulties caused by hearing problems.

<u>Special needs education schools for physically disabled students</u> (All are run by Aichi Prefecture.)

Education at these schools emphasizes overcoming impairments of the limbs or any other part of the body and recovering and improving the functions of these parts, by using specially-designed facilities, equipment, and teaching materials and tools.

<u>Special needs education schools for health impaired students</u> (All are run by Aichi Prefecture.)

These schools provide education to students in need of special medical care or lifestyle management, in a manner tailored to individual health conditions.

Special needs education high schools

(All are run by Aichi Prefecture.)

These are special needs education schools only with an upper secondary department, which are for students with mild intellectual disabilities. Here, vocational training is offered to help them get jobs at businesses.

Special needs education class for students with autism or emotional disturbance

Besides studying the same coursework as regular class students, students with autism learn to foster personal relationships and observe rules in daily living. Students with selective mutism are guided to achieve psychological stability and develop the ability to act as a team.

Special needs education class for health impaired/physically weak students (including in-hospital class)

This class offers elementary and junior high school education to students who need constant medical care or live under restrictions due to chronic illness, paying close attention to their physical conditions. In-hospital classes are designed to teach hospitalized children in a manner that suits their individual medical conditions.

Education at resource rooms in regular schools

Resource room education allows elementary and junior high school students with disabilities who are enrolled in regular class to receive special education tailored to individual disabilities, while studying coursework together with regular class students. Resource room education is provided at the school the student is enrolled in or at another school, or by visiting teachers.

Promoting individualized educational support program

The individualized educational support program is designed to offer long-term support to students with disabilities consistently from infancy to graduation from school and beyond, in a manner precisely tailored to their individual needs. Cooperation with parents and other organizations is essential for developing the program.

The program involves reviewing the results of support from time to time, and changing the way support is provided as necessary, while sharing information with parents.



Support staff service at kindergarten/school life

We provide school life assistance assistants and other staffing services for young children with disabilities, as well as lending hearing aid system equipment. All applications must be made by the school. Please consult with the school regarding the details and methods of the program.

School life assistant

School life assistants are sent to support children and students mainly with physical disabilities in need of assistance or care throughout the year at the kindergartens, elementary schools, and junior and senior high schools they attend. To use this service, parents are required to submit an application through the school.

Caregiver for school event involving overnight stay

When a disabled student, who is supported by a school life assistant on a daily basis and needs assistance for moving around (e.g. using a wheelchair) and/or bathing, participates in a school event involving an overnight stay away from home, a caregiver is sent to accompany the student during the event.

Nursing aides sent to children who need medical care

Nursing aides are assigned to support children who need to receive constant medical care in order to lead their daily lives and social life at school (kindergarten) so that they can maximize their individual abilities. To use this service, parents are required to submit an application through the school (kindergarten).

Loan out hearing aids to children with hearing impairments.

This system is designed to assist hearing impaired students. The system consists of a receiver and a transmitter (microphone for the teacher).

The transmitter (microphone for the teacher) is loaned to schools for use by students who wish to use this system.

Expand textbooks

These textbooks are published by enlarging and duplicating the letters and figures in the approved textbooks for children with poor eyesight. They are provided free of charge in place of regular textbooks.

Since each child sees differently, a physician will consult with the child to determine if it is appropriate to use magnified textbooks for education.

Converting educational materials to audio

These materials are designed for children who have difficulty recognizing letters and figures in regular textbooks, and have functions such as reading aloud the contents of the textbook using a PC, tablet, or other terminal.

Wheelchair Stairlifts

We lend stair lifts to schools for children with physical disabilities who have difficulty going up and down stairs.

Encouraging the "exchange activities and collaborative learning" practice

Opportunities for students with and without disabilities to work together contribute to the purpose of "exchange activities" to nurture positive human qualities through personal interactions, and that of "collaborative learning" to attain study goals.

The "exchange activities and collaborative learning" practice thus serves both of these purposes, and helps students with disabilities develop independence and social skills and learn to live in harmony with various members of society through mutual help and support.
