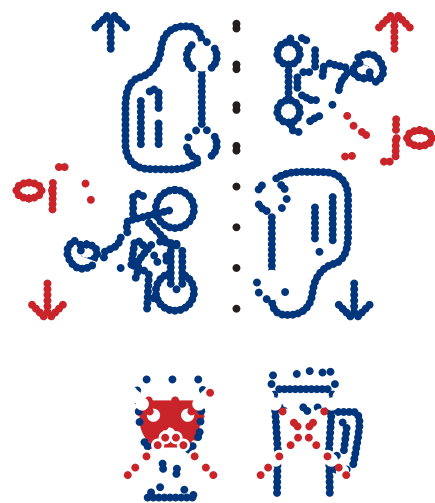
This leaflet will help you find information you need to live a comfortable life in Naka Ward, Nagoya City, including applicable laws and rules.

Road traffic laws

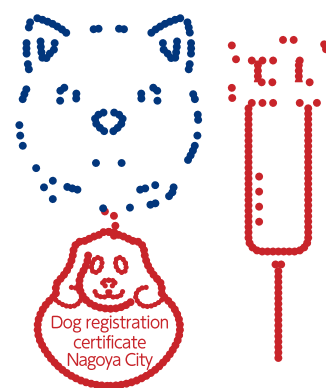
Cars, motorbikes, and bicycles keep to the left, while people keep to the right. Drink driving is strictly prohibited. Cars and bicycles must be insured.

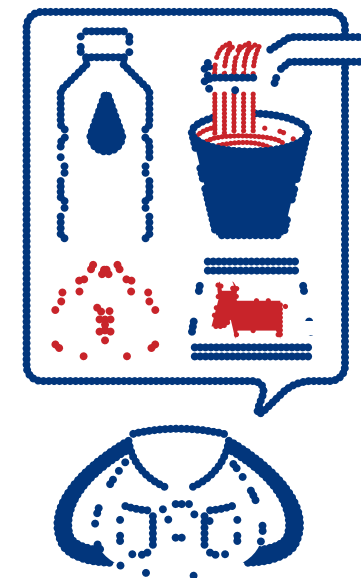

Keep emergency supplies in an easy-to-carry container in an easily accessible location.



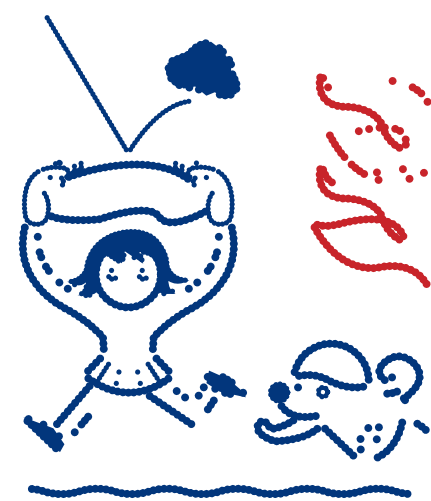
Earthquake response

3. Evacuate



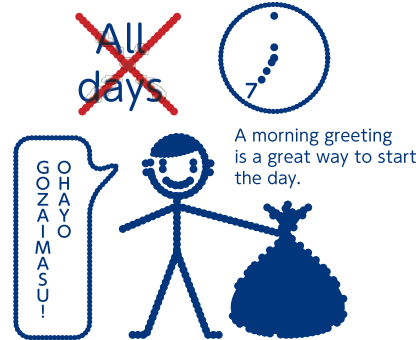
Self-help efforts

Garbage

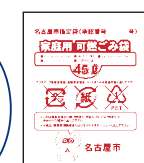
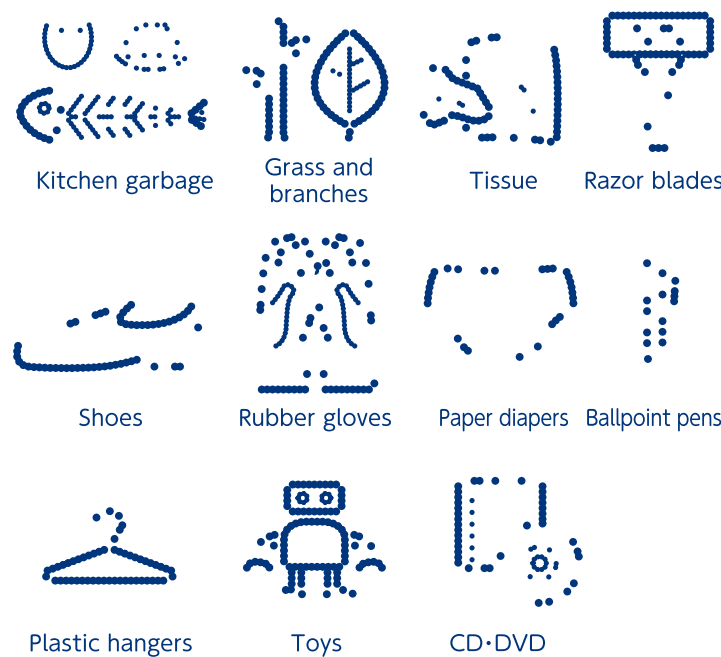
On garbage collection days, please put your garbage out at your collection site by 7:00 a.m. Garbage must be disposed of in designated bags.



Garbage collection days are scheduled according to garbage type. (Garbage pick-up days vary according to address. Please contact the Environmental Office.) You can look up garbage collection schedules with a smartphone app called "3R."

Combustible garbage

Kitchen and other types of garbage that can be incinerated (Garbage of which one side is longer than 30 cm is categorized as bulk garbage and cannot be disposed of on combustible garbage collection days.)



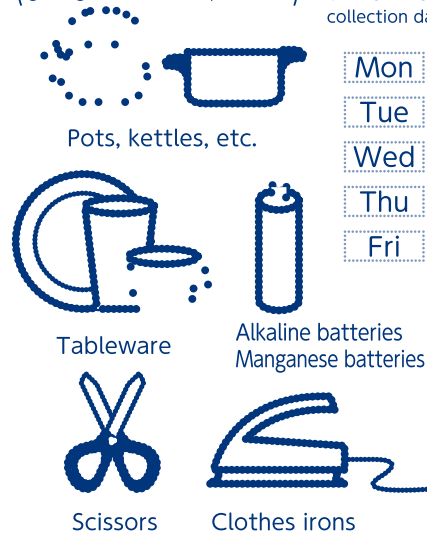
Garbage must be disposed of in designated bags. Please confirm your garbage collection day.

Non-combustible garbage

Garbage that cannot be incinerated

(Garbage of which one side is longer than 30 cm is categorized as bulk garbage and cannot be disposed of on non-combustible garbage collection days.)

PET plastic bottles

PET plastic bottles are categorized as recyclable garbage.

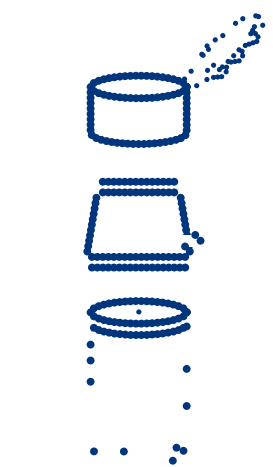
Glass bottles

Cans are categorized as recyclable garbage.



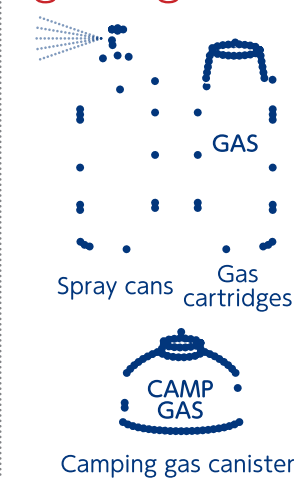
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Recyclables and garbage separation app "3R"

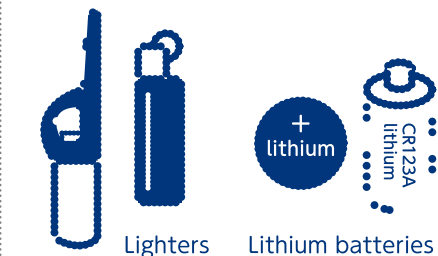


Explosive garbage



Garbage must be disposed of in designated bags. Please confirm your garbage collection day.

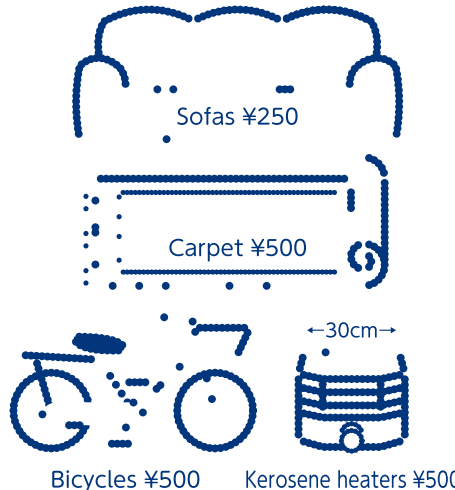
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Bulk garbage

(Nagoya Castle)

On the roof of the keep is a pair
of golden dolphin-like creatures,
which is a symbol of Nagoya.



(Nagoya Noh Theater)

Noh and Kyogen, traditional Japanese
performing arts, are performed at this theater.



(Aichi Prefectural
Library)

The library has
a Multicultural Service
Corner to serve people
from other countries.



(Nagoya City Hall)
(main building)

The architecture of the hall, which is
characterized by its castle-like roof
with four dolphin-like creatures on its top,
is designated as a tangible cultural
asset of Japan.



(Nagoya TV Tower and
Hisaya-odori Park)

Nagoya TV Tower, a landmark of Nagoya,
started operations in 1954.



(Aichi Arts Center)

(a complex of Aichi Prefectural Museum of Art, Aichi
Prefectural Arts Theater, and Aichi Prefectural Arts
Promotion Service)

Located in the center of Nagoya, this cultural complex
can be used for full-scale opera productions.



(Oasis 21) (Sakae Park)

Oasis 21, a complex including a park and a bus terminal,
is a shopping and event- entertainment destination.
Because of its unique design, this facility has been popular
as a photo spot among visitors from other countries.



(Nagoya City Science Museum)
(located in Shirakawa Park)

The museum has a planetarium with a diameter of
35 meters, and has been named the world's largest
by the Guinness World Records (as of December 2017).



(Nagoya City Art Museum)
(located in Shirakawa Park)

It mainly exhibits works of art by local artists
and organizes special exhibitions.



(Osaka Kannon Temple)

Originally constructed in Osu, Mino, the temple
was relocated to its present site under the orders
of Tokugawa Iyasu.



(Hisaya-odori Garden Flarie)

The garden consists of six specialized gardens,
restaurants, a cafe, and a flower shop.
Admission is free of charge.
