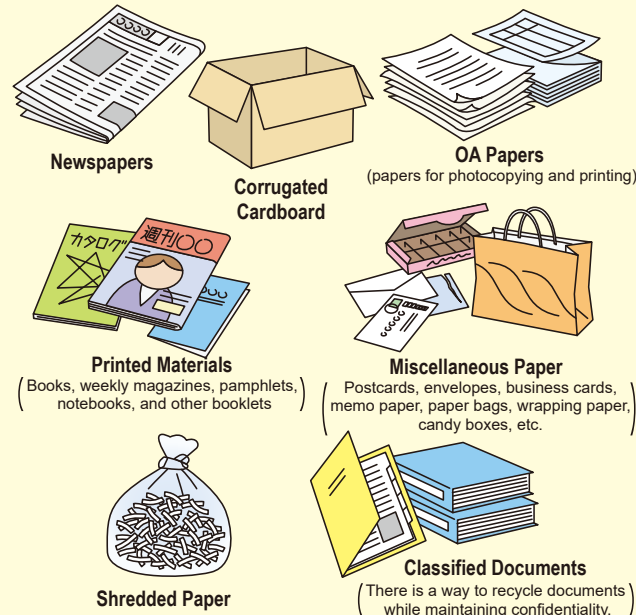
Recyclables

The following **are not collectable as waste**.
Separate these items into the following categories for recycling.

For specific sorting and disposal methods, please contact the licensed collection company or resource recovery company you have contracted to collect the waste.

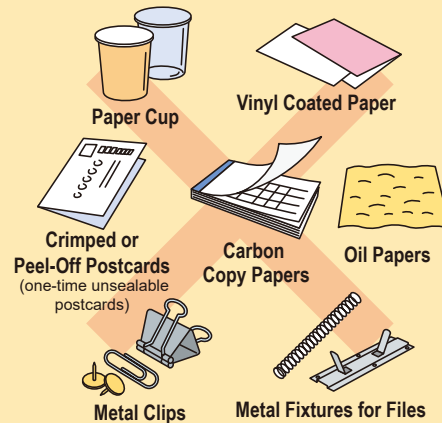
Used Papers

Separate and gather newspapers, magazines, cardboard, etc. into categories. The disposal method of OA papers and shredded papers is different depending on the disposal company. Confirm with the disposal company for more specific information.



Do Not Mix (Prohibited Items)

These items interfere with the paper recycling process. Please take caution not to mix these items with other recyclables. (Please contact a disposal company for more information.)



Collection of the following items is limited to **small amounts comparable to those of a household**.

A "small amount from a household" is ... The disposal rate per category is **one designated 45-liter (20-liter for spray cans per week) bag per collection day per business** with the same properties as would be disposed of by an average household.

< Important Points > If the amount of waste generated does not fall under the category of small household waste, please request disposal by a disposal company.

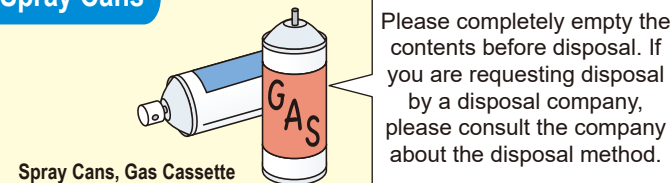
Empty Glass Jars and Bottles

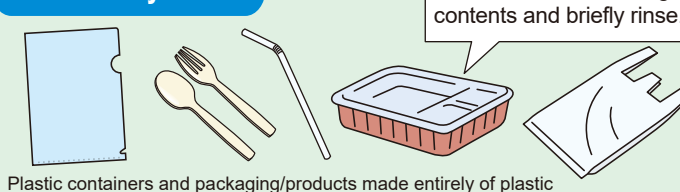
Spray Cans



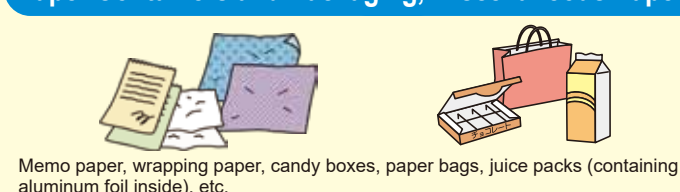
Recyclable Plastic Bottles

<Important Points for City Recyclables Collection>

- For more information about collection days and areas, contact your local Environmental Works Office in the ward where waste is generated.
- Plastic recyclables, spray cans are collected by household. An application to your Environmental Works Office is required for collection.
- Please use bags designated for household recyclables.
- Used paper (with some exceptions) is not collected by the city. Please contact the licensed company or resource recovery company that has been commissioned to collect it.

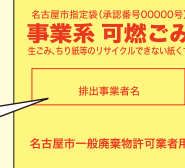
Garbage

Plastic, rubber, metal, glass, ceramics, etc. generated from business activities **are industrial waste**. Please request disposal as industrial waste.

However, only if the properties and amount of waste generated are similar to those of household waste can the waste be commissioned to a licensed company for disposal as burnable waste, non-burnable waste, or hazardous flammable items.

For licensed operator collection (Burnable waste designated bag)



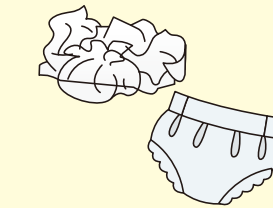
Waste generators write their name here.

(Tissue paper, disposable diapers, etc.)

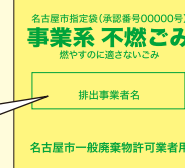


Natural Fibers, Leathers

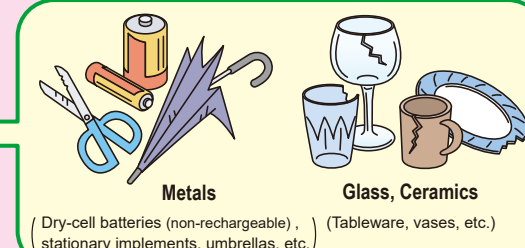
(Clothing, bags)

Glass, Ceramics

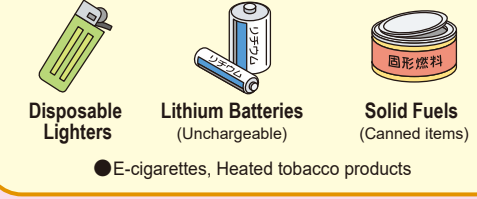
(Tableware, vases, etc.)

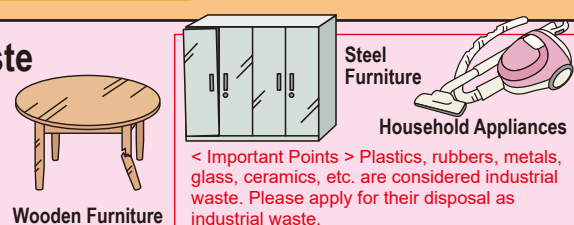
<Important Points>

These items (plastics, rubbers, metals, glass, ceramics, etc.) are considered industrial waste. Please apply for their disposal as industrial waste.

However, in cases where burnable waste, non-burnable waste, and hazardous flammable items of the same characteristics and quantity as would be disposed of by a regular household are put out, the items may be commissioned to a licensed operator for processing.

Large-Sized Waste

Large items exceeding 30cm on any dimension cannot be put out with burnable or non-burnable waste. Please consult with a licensed operator for collection.

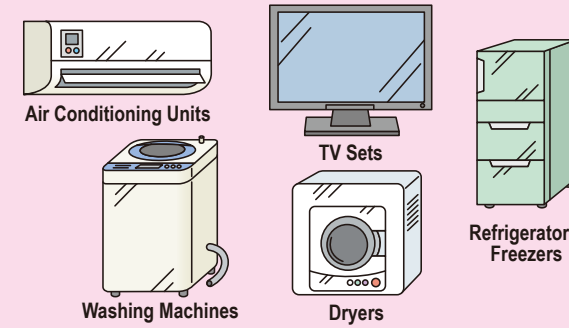
Household Appliances

< Important Points > Plastics, rubbers, metals, glass, ceramics, etc. are considered industrial waste. Please apply for their disposal as industrial waste.

Fluorescent Lights, Mercury Thermometers

<Important Points> Please apply for their disposal as industrial waste. However, if the properties are the same as those of household fluorescent tubes (for fluorescent tubes, both straight and round tubes up to about 40W in size) and the amount of waste per business is the same as that of households (several tubes), they can be collected at the city's collection center. Please check the city's website for details.

Devices Applicable to the Home Appliance Recycle Law (Commercial devices are not applicable.)



1 Request disposal from an appliance retailer

Request collection at the store where you will buy your new appliance or the store where you bought the old one.

*A recycling and collection/transport fee are required.

2 Take the appliance to a designated commercial disposal location yourself.

After paying the recycling fee at a post office, bring the appliance to a designated commercial disposal location.

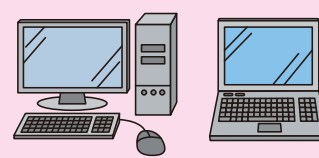
*A recycling fee is required but a collection/transport fee is not.

3 Consign a disposal from an industrial waste disposal company.

Please request a disposal from an industrial waste disposal company.

*A recycling and collection/transport fee are required.

Computers



Contact the recycling desk of each manufacturer directly or contact an industrial waste disposal company for disposal.

Compact appliance

As part of the items collected by the city, cases where items of the same characteristics and quantity as would be disposed of by a regular household can be collected in municipal compact appliance collection boxes. See the City of Nagoya website for more details.

The city does not collect business-related waste (except certain recyclable materials.) Businesses are responsible for properly disposing of these wastes.
