

## Battery Collection in Bulk

### [Changes]

- Batteries will be collected in bulk starting July 2022.
- \* Batteries: alkaline / manganese dry cell batteries, lithium batteries, button cell batteries, small rechargeable batteries
- In principle, batteries will be collected once per week on the same day as plastic containers and packaging.

### 【Objective】

There has been a rapid increase in fires due to mixing lithium-ion batteries with non-burnable and oversized garbage. Collecting batteries all at once (in bulk) will help prevent fires and lead to a more stable garbage collection process.






### [Setting out batteries for collection]

- Place them in a transparent / translucent bag that allows you to see the contents.
- \* Do not use any of the Nagoya garbage or recycle bags.

### 【Request】

- Mixing batteries with plastic containers and packaging may cause fires. Be sure to put batteries in a separate bag from plastic containers and packaging.
- Cover the plus and minus sides of lithium batteries, button cell batteries, and compact rechargeable batteries with insulators such as cellophane tape when setting batteries out for collection.
- Lead-acid batteries such as automobile batteries will not be collected.

Compact Rechargeable Batteries (Lithium-ion batteries, nickel-cadmium batteries, nickel-metal hydride batteries with the recycling symbol shown to the right)   Recycling Symbol	Bring to collection site (Environmental works offices, home appliance stores, etc.)  (※Note)	

\* Note: There will be no changes to battery collection services at stores even after July 2022.
