Special Needs Education in Nagoya City

Special needs education is designed to offer appropriate guidance and assistance to children with disabilities to help them enhance their abilities and improve or overcome difficulties in everyday life or study in a manner that suits their individual educational needs, thereby encouraging them to develop independence and social skills.

Please see below for the educational and support services available in the city to help these children maximize their abilities.

Educational consultation and school choice

In Nagoya City, vice-principals in each local school district offer educational consultation to help parents of disabled children determine the type of school and education best suited to their children in light of the nature and severity of disability, while respecting the wishes of the parents and children as much as possible.

Steps to choosing a school/class to attend

The following flowchart shows the steps to choosing, through educational consultation, a school/class to attend from among regular class, resource room in a regular school, special needs education class and special needs education school. The school/class chosen at the time of enrollment can be changed if necessary considering the child's developmental stage and adaptability to the school/class setting.

Education at special needs education schools

Nagoya City has four municipal special needs education schools and one branch school, all of which are designed for intellectually disabled students. All the special needs education schools for visually impaired, hearing impaired, physically disabled and health impaired/physically weak students located in Nagoya City are run by Aichi Prefecture. Enrollment at any of these schools is subject to educational consultation at a Nagoya municipal elementary or junior high school in the local school district and then at the relevant special needs education school.

While all the special needs education high schools are run by Aichi Prefecture, the business course of municipal Moriyama School for the Intellectually Disabled provides education equivalent to special needs education high school. Acceptance into any of these schools is subject to meeting admission criteria.

Education at Nagoya municipal special needs education schools for intellectually disabled students

The following schools are designed for intellectually disabled students who need constant assistance in daily living due to communication difficulties. Education at these schools aims to help students establish basic lifestyle habits and develop social and vocational skills.

Minami School for the Intellectually Disabled also sends teachers to the homes of students who have difficulties in commuting to school due to severe or multiple disabilities.

The upper secondary department (business course) in Moriyama School for the Intellectually Disabled offers vocational training to students with mild intellectual disabilities in its three programs – welfare, manufacturing and physical distribution/service – to help them get jobs at businesses, etc.

Special needs education schools for visually impaired students

(All are run by Aichi Prefecture.)

These schools use regular, large-print or braille textbooks according to the severity of impairment and let students learn through auditory and tactile senses, thereby helping alleviate and overcome difficulties caused by visual problems.

Special needs education schools for hearing impaired students

(All are run by Aichi Prefecture.)

In addition to providing elementary and junior high school education, these schools guide students to improve their ability to hear, speak, read and write using a hearing aid and other devices, thereby helping alleviate and overcome difficulties caused by hearing problems.

Special needs education schools for physically disabled students

(All are run by Aichi Prefecture.)

Education at these schools emphasizes overcoming impairments of the limbs or any other part of the body and recovering and improving the functions of these parts, by using specially-designed facilities, equipment, and teaching materials and tools.

Special needs education schools for health impaired students

(All are run by Aichi Prefecture.)

These schools provide education to students in need of special medical care or lifestyle management, in a manner tailored to individual health conditions.

Special needs education high schools

(All are run by Aichi Prefecture.)

These are special needs education schools only with an upper secondary department, which are for students with mild intellectual disabilities. Here, vocational training is offered to help them get jobs at businesses.

Special needs education class for intellectually disabled students

Designed for intellectually disabled students who need assistance in some aspects of daily living, this class allows them to learn from daily life experiences and study issues related to their individual needs while studying coursework, and guides them to develop independence. Students are also offered opportunities to interact and study with regular class students, which helps them develop the ability to act as a team and nurture positive human qualities.

Special needs education class for students with autism or emotional disturbance

Besides studying the same coursework as regular class students, students with autism learn to foster personal relationships and observe rules in daily living. Students with selective mutism are guided to achieve psychological stability and develop the ability to act as a team.

Special needs education class for health impaired/physically weak students (including in-hospital class)

This class offers elementary and junior high school education to students who need constant medical care or live under restrictions due to chronic illness, paying close attention to their physical conditions. In-hospital classes are designed to teach hospitalized children in a manner that suits their individual medical conditions.

Promoting individualized educational support program

The individualized educational support program is designed to offer long-term support to students with disabilities consistently from infancy to graduation from school and beyond, in a manner precisely tailored to their individual needs. Cooperation with parents and other organizations is essential for developing the program.

The program involves reviewing the results of support from time to time, and changing the way support is provided as necessary, while sharing information with parents.



Support staff service at kindergarten/school life

Nagoya City offers a support service in which supporters such as school life assistants help children and students with disabilities at the kindergartens and schools they attend. For details about this service, please consult with the vice-principal in the local school district in charge of educational consultation.

School life assistant

School life assistants are sent to support children and students mainly with physical disabilities in need of assistance or care throughout the year at the kindergartens, elementary schools, and junior and senior high schools they attend. To use this service, parents are required to submit an application through the kindergarten or school.

Caregiver for school event involving overnight stay

When a disabled student, who is supported by a school life assistant on a daily basis and needs assistance for moving around (e.g. using a wheelchair) and/or bathing, participates in a school event involving an overnight stay away from home, a caregiver is sent to accompany the student during the event.

Instructor for students with developmental disorder

Instructors are sent to 70 elementary and junior high schools in Nagoya City (FY2021) to support individualized teaching for students suspected of having a developmental disorder and help them adapt to school life. These instructors work with class teachers for team teaching, while giving personalized lessons separately.

Supporter for children and students with developmental disorder

A supporter is assigned to all the kindergartens and elementary and junior high schools in Nagoya City to provide assistance as needed to children and students suspected of having a developmental disorder at the kindergartens and schools they attend.

The supporters, who are available also during breaks and lunch time, assist children and students in various

ways, such as helping them prepare for class and put away their belongings, soothing them when they feel uneasy, and, when they have trouble with other children, settling the trouble and ensuring safety, other than giving study guidance.

Nursing care for children and students in need of medical care

Nurses or nutritionists are sent to support children and students who need daily medical care such as suctioning of phlegm, management of gastric fistula and withdrawing of urine at the kindergartens, elementary schools, and junior and senior high schools they attend, to help them maximize their abilities. To use this service, parents are required to submit an application through the kindergarten or school.

Encouraging the “exchange activities and collaborative learning” practice

Opportunities for students with and without disabilities to work together contribute to the purpose of “exchange activities” to nurture positive human qualities through personal interactions, and that of “collaborative learning” to attain study goals.

The “exchange activities and collaborative learning” practice thus serves both of these purposes, and helps students with disabilities develop independence and social skills and learn to live in harmony with various members of society through mutual help and support.

Other support services

The following support services are available for students with disabilities subject to application from the schools they attend. To use any of these services, please first consult with the school your child attends.



Hearing aid system rental

A hearing aid system is used to compensate for impaired hearing and consists of a receiver and a transmitter. Nagoya City lends a transmitter (microphone to be used by a teacher) to the school to support students who use a hearing aid system.

Large-print textbooks

Large-print textbooks are reproductions of government-approved textbooks with enlarged texts and pictures, which are distributed for free to weak-sighted students in place of regular textbooks.

To determine the necessity of large-print textbooks and appropriate size of texts and pictures, consultation is offered by a doctor, as the level of vision impairment varies from student to student.

Stairlift rental

Nagoya City lends a stairlift to the school to support physically disabled students who have difficulties in using stairs.
