What became of the Jewish refugees who obtained transit visas from Sugihara? Most of them left Kaunas and took the Trans-Siberian Railway to Vladivostok, where they boarded a ship and arrived at Tsuruga Port in Japan. Then, via Kobe and Yokohama, they reached third nations such as the U.S. and

In 1985, Sugihara, then 85, received the honor of "Righteous Among the Nations" (the Yad Vashem Award). This is the most honorable title and award given by the Israeli government with gratitude to non-Jews who risked their lives to save Jewish people. The commemorative medal given to Sugihara bears the inscription: "Whosoever saves a single life, saves an entire universe."

Forty-five years had passed since he had issued the visas, and admiration for Sugihara's achievements never diminished.

Chiune Sugihara, known for his "Visas for Life," was a Japanese diplomat. In World War II, he saved a large number of Jewish people by issuing more than 2,000 visas to Jewish refugees who were trying to escape persecution.

As a child, Sugihara lived in Nagova for about ten years. Praising his great achievements, the city of Nagova has named the route that links the place where he lived with his old school, Aichi Prefectural Daigo Junior High School (present-day Aichi Prefectural Zuiryo High School), as "Chiune Sugihara's Walk of Humanitarianism (Jindo no michi)."
