
Toward Nagoya's future as a leading global city



About the City of Nagoya Master Plan 2023

Nagoya City's Master Plan is a long-term vision for our city that will ensure the comprehensive and systematic management of the city government. The Master Plan is a blueprint outlining the actions that need to be implemented to achieve our vision of Nagoya's future.

Nagoya City Master Plan 2023 imagines what our city will be like in 2030 – after our city has hosted the 20th Asian Games and after commencement of the Chuo Shinkansen (maglev) line services between Shinagawa (Tokyo) and Nagoya. The Master Plan includes a list of actions and projects that need to be implemented over the five years from 2019 to 2023.

Current Issues for the City of Nagoya

- Demographic changes due to a falling birth rate and aging society
- Population forecasts predict that Nagoya City's population will begin to fall in 2023 when the number of deaths begins to exceed the number of births.
- The working population responsible for supporting all members of society is expected to decrease and the number of elderly people is expected to increase.
- 2 Diversification of values and lifestyles
- The structure of families and households is changing, as well as the way people interact with each other.
- . The number of foreign residents* has increased significantly in recent years.
- 3 Concerns about natural disasters
- The possibility of an earthquake is on the rise with a 70-80% probability of a massive earthquake occurring in the Nankai Trough in the next 30 years.
- . The frequency of torrential rain has increased in recent years.
- 4 Concerns about environmental sustainability
- Average temperatures in Nagoya City are rising in the long-term.
- · Green areas and natural spaces are becoming less common.
- 5 Changes due to the opening of the Chuo Shinkansen maglev line
- The opening of the Chuo Shinkansen maglev line is expected to boost interactions between a wide variety of people.
- There are concerns that the opening of the new line could result a drain of people and business opportunities from Nagoya to Tokyo.
- 6 Increasing visitor numbers
- Nagoya City has seen a significant increase in the number of foreign visitors in recent years.
- The 20th Asian Games will be hosted by Aichi Prefecture and Nagoya City in 2026.
- 7 Changes in the industrial sector
- Technological innovation has been in progress, supporting the development of IoT,* AI,* robots, and self-driving cars.
- There are also concerns about future worker shortages due to the declining birth rate.
- 8 Deterioration of older public buildings and infrastructure
- Public buildings such as schools and municipal apartment buildings, as well as public infrastructure including roads, rivers, parks, and water/sewage pipes are getting older, meaning that they require repairs and maintenance.
- 9 Adoption of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- The SDGs aim to create a society where no-one is left behind, providing a comprehensive plan of action to deal with a wide range of economic, social, and environmental issues.
- In July 2019, Nagoya was selected by the national government as one of the "SDGs Future Cities" (cities that suggest excellent initiatives toward achieving the SDGs).

About the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are universal goals for countries all over the world, adopted as part of the Sustainable Development Agenda at the UN Sustainable Development Summit in September 2015. The 17 SDGs and 169 targets, established as goals to be achieved by 2030, cover a wide range of fields including health, education, economic growth, and climate change.

^{*} IoT: (Internet of Things) IoT refers to the extension of internet connectivity to everyday objects in addition to information and telecommunications devices such as computers. IoT allows these everyday objects to connect to the internet and communicate with other devices, enabling automatic identification, automatic controls, and remote monitoring.

^{*} Al: (Artificial Intelligence) Technologies allowing computers to become intelligent machines that can understand language, reason, and solve problems on behalf of human beings.

Maximizing Nagoya's strengths

The completion of the Chuo Shinkansen maglev line extension from Nagoya to Osaka will spark the formation of the most densely populated super mega-region* in the world with a population of 70 million people. The City of Nagoya will be located at the heart of this new mega-region, so our city needs to maximize its strengths including its reputation as a pleasant place to live, its economic strengths, and its unique, rich history and culture.

Boosting growth by establishing core functions in the Greater Nagoya* area

Nagoya City is located at the heart of the Greater Nagoya area. In addition to providing everyday support to residents, the City of Nagoya has added a range of advanced core functions to fulfil its role and help it develop as a regional hub and better assist the growth and development of people and businesses located in the area. The City of Nagoya is keenly aware of the importance of its role, always considering benefits for the wider region and boosting the growth of the Greater Nagoya area through comprehensive coordination with local governments in the area.

Making Nagoya the best city in Japan for growing families! Achieving a reliable, user-friendly welfare system for elderly people as well

To ensure sustainable development in the future, the City of Nagoya needs to ensure that it is a city that attracts many people from far and wide. We aim to create a city where everyone can live in safety and security, a city where each and every resident can live their lives and utilize their potential to the fullest, a city that is truly welcoming for growing families, and a city where preventable child deaths do not occur. The main focus of our city's actions as a local government will be to ensure the enhancement of welfare services for residents, respect for human rights, and the promotion of a diverse society where individual values and lifestyles are accepted. Our urban planning will focus on boosting the dynamic nature of our regional community, creating a harmonious society where residents support each other, and everyone can live a rewarding, fulfilling life.

Protecting lives and industry from the threat of major natural disasters for safe and secure everyday living

Our city has a fundamental obligation to protect residents' lives and industry from the threat of earthquakes and heavy rains. We also have a duty to ensure that everyone can enjoy safe and secure lifestyles by protecting residents from the threat of fire, traffic accidents, and crime in their everyday lives. A diverse range of organizations, including community groups, companies, and NPOs*, are joining forces with local government authorities to comprehensively prepare for the possibility of a major disaster, including boosting regional disaster preparedness and enhancing urban disaster prevention functions, as well as actively enhancing and strengthening firefighting services, ensuring traffic safety, and preventing crime.

^{*} Super mega-region: Tokyo, Nagoya, and Osaka currently form a massive urban region called a mega-region. The completion of the entire Chuo Shinkansen maglev line will bring these three metropolises even closer together, forming the most densely populated super mega-region in the world while allowing each city to maintain its unique characteristics.

Greater Nagoya: A region with a radius of approximately 30-50 kilometers centering on the City of Nagoya. The actual size of the area can differ according to specific focuses (e.g. industry, tourism, and disaster preparedness).

^{*} NPO: Non-Profit or Not-for-Profit Organization

Attracting people, goods, capital, and information to create new values and achieve sustainable economic growth

Throughout history, economic growth has always been powered by innovation*. Continuous innovation is the key to enhancing the capabilities of our industrial sector and ensuring the sustainable development of the region. The City of Nagoya aims to become an innovation hub that powers global growth by actively promoting the utilization of cutting-edge technologies, promoting growth industries, as well as training and securing the human resources that will support the future of our industrial sector. These efforts will continue to create new values to achieve our goal of sustained, robust economic growth. Our city will also engage in the strategic promotion of tourism and MICE* events to secure tourist spending in Nagoya and further invigorate the region.

Restoring the wooden main tower keep of Nagoya Castle to establish a global tourist attraction and create the most authentic modern citadel in Japan on the designated Special National Historic Site of Nagoya Castle

A wide range of historical documents are being used to recreate the wooden main tower keep of Nagoya Castle in the most historically accurate way possible. We aim to create the most authentic example of a historical castle stronghold in Japan, along with the Hommaru Palace, bringing it into the modern era to maximize the historic value and appeal of the Special National Historic Site of Nagoya Castle and ensure that this heritage is passed down to future generations.

Making Nagoya City an appealing global destination, reflecting locals' civic pride in our city

Nagoya City will work to enhance new aspects of its appeal to promote historical and industrial tourism and establish Nagoya as a global brand. This will be achieved by focusing on creating and communicating culture and arts unique to Nagoya such as famous Nagoya dishes, anime, cosplay, and sports. We will also focus on further enhancing areas that are already hold significant appeal for visitors, deepening civic pride (attachment to and pride in our city). Local residents and local governments will come together to communicate the appeal of Nagoya to the world, establishing the city as a place of endless appeal and civic pride, and an exciting global destination.

Deepening ties with countries throughout Asia to establish Nagoya City as a hub for international exchange in Asia and the world

The hosting of the 20th Asian Games by Aichi Prefecture and Nagoya City in 2026 will be an opportunity to promote the appeal of Nagoya to people in other Asian countries, as well as an incredible chance to enhance and expand exchange with people from all over Asia. In preparation for the Asian Games, the entire City of Nagoya is preparing the ideal environment to welcome athletes and visitors, in addition to creating and communicating Nagoya's appeal, and revitalizing our city through sports and the creation of a harmonious society. The City of Nagoya intends to maximize the positive effects of the event wherever possible through solid preparations and by establishing itself as a major Japanese city ideally positioned for exchange with Asia and the rest of the world.

Establishing Nagoya as a leading city in the maglev era

As we move into the maglev era, Nagoya intends to maximize the positive effects of Chuo Shinkansen maglev line. Proactive investment will be made into boosting Nagoya's urban functions to inspire industrial exchange, disaster preparedness and convenience based on the city's strong economic foundations. This will further enhance Nagoya's global competitiveness and allow our city to become a driver of growth in Japan as the center of the new super mega-region in the maglev era.

^{*} MICE: Short for Meeting, Incentive Travel, Convention and Exhibition/Event. The term refers to any kind of business event that attracts a large number of people and facilitates their interaction. Examples include company meetings, corporate incentive travel, conventions held by international organizations, groups, and academic societies, as well as exhibitions, trade fairs and related events.

^{*}Facilities and residential service(s): Services provided to people who come to or live in facilities such as special nursing homes for the elderly, healthcare facilities for the elderly requiring long-term care, and group homes for dementia patients.



1) Administrative services that respect human rights and value each individual

City employees are keenly aware of their responsibilities as public servants and their duty to provide public support in a manner that ensures that the human rights of every person are upheld. Employees are required to make fair and impartial decisions and carry out their duties with integrity. The City of Nagoya is working to provide administrative services that value each individual by providing opportunities for a diverse range of residents to ensure that their views are reflected in the city's policies and services.

②Ensuring a fair and transparent administration

The City of Nagoya provides easy-to-understand information to residents in a diverse range of formats as part of its efforts to communicate and release useful information. The city is working to ensure that the Personal Information Protection System is managed appropriately so that residents' personal information is protected.

③Region-led urban planning

The city promotes the participation of residents in regional urban planning projects as well as providing support for the independent and self-organized activities of regional residents, regional groups, and NPOs. Each ward office aims to provide easy access to a comprehensive range of administrative services, working in partnership with regional residents and other groups to ensure their independence and self-reliance as part of efforts to improve regional disaster preparedness capabilities, promote regional welfare, and implement urban planning projects that reflect the unique characteristics of each ward.


Positioning Nagoya as a Central Metropolis

1) Promoting coordination between local governments in the Greater Nagoya Area

Nagoya aims to build on the strengths of the Greater Nagoya Area by promoting better coordination between local governments in the area. Nagoya City is leading the enhancement of collaboration and cooperation with neighboring cities, towns, and villages based on the understanding that all local governments in the wider area share a common purpose and a common destiny.

②Establishing a Special Municipality System

The City of Nagoya, along with other ordinance-designated cities, is actively lobbying the national government to create a Special Municipality System that will allocate centralized responsibility for regional administrative duties to major cities. There are also efforts being made to transfer decision-making authority and tax revenues from the national and prefectural governments to cities.

The 20th Asian Games and the Opening of the Chuo Shinkansen Maglev Line




Aichi-Nagoya to Host the 20th Asian Games in 2026!

The 20th Asian Games will be jointly hosted by the City of Nagoya and Aichi Prefecture in 2026. The Asian Games, also known as the Asian Olympics, are Asia's biggest international sporting tournament, held once every four years. Approximately 15,000 athletes, trainers, and coaches are expected to visit the area during the tournament in addition to approximately 1.5 million spectators.

The City of Nagoya intends to ensure that the positive effects of the Asian Games continue on long after the tournament has ended. The momentum created by the Games will be utilized in a wide range of fields to promote sporting activities, expand the non-resident population, promote international exchange, build a harmonious society, and boost international competitiveness.

The following section introduces basic objectives shared by residents, businesses, universities, NPOs, and many other organizations that will be used to maximize the positive effects of two major projects.

Chuo Shinkansen Maglev Line Services (Shinagawa – Nagoya) Will Begin in 2027!

The Chuo Shinkansen maglev line is a new type of high-speed transport utilizing magnetic levitation technology to connect the Tokyo metropolitan area and Osaka City (the line will be approximately 438 kilometers in length). The journey from Tokyo to Nagoya will be reduced to approximately 40 minutes, down from the current time of approximately 100 minutes. Once the entire line is in operation, passengers will be able to access all three major cities along the line – Tokyo, Osaka, and Nagoya – within approximately 1 hour.

The opening of the line will create the world's most populous super mega-region with 70 million residents and Nagoya located at its center. This exciting development will allow Nagoya to diversify its economic activities by utilizing its world-class manufacturing technologies and advanced transport network. Using this momentum, Nagoya will develop into an appealing international city that attracts people from all over the world with an interest in industry, tourism, and many other fields.


(1) Project Progress Monitoring

Effectiveness indicators and targets will be set for each policy area to monitor progress. Figures showing progress toward achieving each target will be compiled and released to the public every financial year. Details for each of the projects included in this Master Plan will include their current statuses and targets to monitor progress. This information will then be released to the public each year. After this Master Plan has concluded, the City of Nagoya will evaluate and verify the targets and actual outcomes of each of the projects in the Master Plan. All results will then be compiled and utilized to enable more effective administration of the city in the future.

(2) Priority Budget Allocation

Each financial year, the budget will be allocated to each major strategy in keeping with the progress made in each area to ensure that funds are allocated to where they are needed most.
